

Ordinance no. 57/XVI R/2026

of the Rector of Wrocław Medical University

of 27 April 2026

**on determining the amount and deadlines for payment of tuition fees since the academic
year 2026/2027**

Based on Art. 79 and Art. 324 sec. 1 and 2 of the Law of 20 July 2018 Law on Higher Education (consolidated text, Book of Laws of 2024, item 1571, as amended), I order as follows:

Chapter I. General Provisions

Art. 1

1. The Wrocław Medical University, hereinafter referred to as the "University", charges tuition fees related to:
 - 1) paid degree courses,
 - 2) repetition of certain classes in full-time studies due to unsatisfactory learning outcomes;
 - 3) studies conducted in a foreign language;
 - 4) conducting classes not included in the curriculum, exceeding the limit of curricular classes,
 - 5) full-time studies for foreigners conducted in the Polish language.
 - 6) conducting confirmation of learning outcomes.
2. The university does not charge a fee for:
 - 1) registration for the next year of study,
 - 2) entering and participating in examinations (including the following: revision, board, and diploma examinations),
 - 3) issuance of the practical training booklet,
 - 4) submission and evaluation of the thesis,
 - 5) issuance of a diploma and diploma supplement.
3. The University does not charge tuition fees related to free degree courses conducted in the Polish language from:
 - 1) a foreigner – a citizen of a member state of the European Union, the Swiss Confederation, or a member state of the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) – a party to the Agreement on the European Economic Area, and members of their families living in the territory of the Republic of Poland,
 - 2) a foreigner – a citizen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, referred to in Art. 10 sec. 1 letter b or d of the Agreement on the Withdrawal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland from the European Union and the European Atomic Energy Community (OJ L 29, 31.01.2020, p. 7, as amended), and members of their family living in the territory of the Republic of Poland,
 - 3) a foreigner who has been granted a permanent residence permit or a long-term resident of the European Union,
 - 4) a foreigner who has been granted a temporary residence permit in connection with the circumstances referred to in Art. 127, Art. 137a, Art. 159 sec. 1, or Art. 186 sec. 1 item 3 or 4 of the Act of 12 December 2013 on Foreigners (Book of Laws of 2025, item 1079, as amended),
 - 5) a foreigner who has the status of a refugee granted in the Republic of Poland or enjoys temporary protection or subsidiary protection in the territory of the Republic of Poland,

- 6) a foreigner – a holder of a certificate confirming the knowledge of Polish as a foreign language, referred to in Art. 11a sec. 2 of the Act of 7 October 1999 on the Polish Language (Book of Laws of 2026, item 81), at least at the C1 language proficiency level,
 - 7) a holder of the Pole's Card or a person who has been issued a decision on the determination of Polish origin,
 - 8) a foreigner who is a spouse, ascendant, or descendant of a citizen of the Republic of Poland, living in the territory of the Republic of Poland,
 - 9) a foreigner who has been granted a temporary residence permit in connection with the circumstances referred to in Art. 151 sec. 1 or Art. 151b sec. 1 of the Act of 12 December 2013 on Foreigners (Book of Laws of 2025, item 1079, as amended), or staying in the territory of the Republic of Poland in connection with using the short-term mobility of a researcher under the conditions specified in Art. 156b sec. 1 of this Act, or holding a national visa for the purpose of conducting scientific research or development work.
4. A foreigner may be exempted from the fees referred to in sec. 1 items 2, 3, and 5 under the rules specified in an agreement between universities or an international agreement.
 5. Exemption of a foreigner from the fees referred to in section 4 may also take place on the basis of:
 - 1) an administrative decision of the Rector,
 - 2) a decision of the minister or a decision of the Director of NAWA with respect to its scholarship holders.

Chapter II. Exemption from tuition fees and payment of tuition fees in instalments

Art. 2

1. A student may apply for a partial exemption from the fees specified in Art. 1 sec. 1, subject to the provisions of Art. 1 sec. 4 and 5, if at least one of the following conditions is met:
 - 1) participation in international scholarship programmes, excluding inter-university exchange programmes concluded on the basis of agreements or arrangements, including, for example, the Erasmus+ programme,
 - 2) documented difficult financial situation or fortuitous events causing a sudden deterioration of the current financial situation in the family.
2. An application for a partial fee exemption may be submitted:
 - 1) in the case referred to in sec. 1 point 1, after each completed academic year of studies undertaken at the University,
 - 2) in the case referred to in sec. 1 point 2, no more than twice during the course of studies, however, no more than once due to a given fortuitous event.
3. A partial exemption from tuition fees for the conditions specified in sec. 1 and 2 may not exceed 50% of the fee amount specified in this ordinance.
4. A justified and documented application for a partial fee exemption must be submitted in the original to the dean's office of the relevant faculty or the dean's office of the branch. After verification by a member of the dean's office staff, the application is forwarded without delay, together with the appendices, to the Rector for a decision on the matter.
5. The basis for applying for payment of tuition fees in instalments, as referred to in Art. 3 sec. 3 point 1 letter b, c and Art. 4 sec. 2 point 1 letter b, c, is an application submitted once for the entire duration of studies, which constitutes Appendix no. 6. The application must be submitted to the dean's office of the relevant faculty or the dean's office of the branch by 1 September. The dean of the relevant faculty or the dean of the branch shall decide on the payment of tuition fees in instalments. A person admitted to the 1st year of studies declares the payment of fees in 2 or 4 instalments in the IRK admission system. A Student may submit a resignation from paying tuition fees in instalments to the dean's office of the relevant faculty or the dean's office of the branch by 1 September.
6. The University publishes information on the rules, amounts, and deadlines for payment of fees on its website.

Chapter III. Deadlines and rules for charging tuition fees related to education in degree courses conducted in Polish

Art. 3

1. Tuition fees referred to in sec. 2 are charged starting from the education cycle beginning on the day of the start of admission for the academic year 2026/2027.
2. The amount of fees charged for tuition related to free or paid degree courses conducted in Polish is specified in Appendix no. 1 to this ordinance.
3. Deadlines and rules for charging tuition fees:
 - 1) With regard to the fees referred to in sec. 2, taking into account point 3, the following payment deadlines apply to students:
 - a) in the case of an annual fee: by 15 September,
 - b) in the case of fees paid in 2 instalments:
 - the 1st instalment for the winter semester payable by 15 September,
 - the 2nd instalment for the summer semester payable by 15 February;
 - c) in the case of fees paid in 4 instalments:
 - the 1st instalment payable by 15 September,
 - the 2nd instalment payable by 15 November,
 - the 3rd instalment payable by 15 February,
 - the 4th instalment payable by 15 May.
 - 2) Persons admitted to the 1st year of studies shall pay the first fee within 3 working days from the date of admission or conditional admission to studies.
 - 3) The date of fee payment is the day of receipt on the individual bank account of the University indicated in the Wirtualna Uczelnia (Virtual University) system.
4. Deadlines and rules for charging tuition fees from students undertaking studies in Medicine in Polish on a paid basis who have concluded an agreement with a bank for a student loan for medical studies:
 - 1) With regard to the fees referred to in sec. 2, taking into account point 3, the following payment deadlines apply:
 - a) in the case of an annual fee - by 31 October,
 - b) in the case of a fee paid in 2 instalments:
 - the 1st instalment for the winter semester payable by 31 October,
 - the 2nd instalment for the summer semester payable by 31 March;
 - 2) Persons admitted to the 1st year of studies shall pay the first fee within 3 working days from the date of admission or conditional admission to studies.
 - 3) The date of fee payment is the day of receipt on the individual bank account of the University indicated in the Wirtualna Uczelnia (Virtual University) system.

Chapter IV. Deadlines and rules for charging tuition fees related to education in free degree courses conducted in a foreign language

Art. 4

1. The amount of tuition fees related to education in free or paid degree courses conducted in English is specified in Appendix no. 2 to this ordinance.
2. Deadlines and rules for charging tuition fees:
 - 1) With regard to the fees referred to in sec. 1, subject to point 3, the following payment deadlines apply to students:
 - a) in the case of an annual fee: by 15 September,

- b) in the case of fees paid in 2 instalments:
 - the 1st instalment for the winter semester payable by 15 September,
 - the 2nd instalment for the summer semester payable by 15 February;
- c) in the case of fees paid in 4 instalments:
 - the 1st instalment payable by 15 September,
 - the 2nd instalment payable by 15 November,
 - the 3rd instalment payable by 15 February,
 - the 4th instalment payable by 15 May.
- 2) Persons admitted to the 1st year of studies shall pay the first fee within 14 days from the date of admission or conditional admission to studies, subject to the deadlines specified in the recruitment schedule, provided that this deadline may not fall later than the closing date of the recruitment process.
- 3) The date of fee payment is the day of receipt on the individual bank account of the University indicated in the Wirtualna Uczelnia (Virtual University) system.

Chapter V. Deadlines and rules for charging tuition fees related to education within classes not included in the curriculum in free or paid degree courses, and repeating certain classes due to unsatisfactory academic performance in free or paid degree courses

Art. 5

1. The amount of tuition fees related to education within classes not included in the curriculum in free or paid degree courses, and repeating certain classes due to unsatisfactory academic performance in free or paid degree courses, is specified in Appendix no. 3 to this ordinance.
2. The amount of the fee for:
 - 1) repeating certain classes due to unsatisfactory academic performance,
 - 2) participating in classes not included in the curriculum, exceeding the limit of curricular classes, such as language courses, optional classes, and others: is calculated on the basis of the number of ECTS points required to pass the subject as specified in the curriculum for a given subject, multiplied by the fee amount specified for 1 ECTS point.
3. In the event of obtaining consent to repeat the classes specified in sec. 2 point 1, the student shall pay the fee only for the repeated subjects. The fee must be paid as a one-off payment, no later than 14 days before the beginning of the semester or within 14 days from the date of delivery of the decision on granting consent to repeat the classes.
4. The fee for participating in classes specified in sec. 2 point 2 shall be paid no later than 7 days before the commencement of these classes, in the amount and by the deadline specified in the decision issued on the basis of the submitted application, which constitutes Appendix no. 7 to this ordinance.

Chapter VI. Amount and deadlines for fees for conducting the procedure of confirmation of learning outcomes

Art. 6

1. The amount of fees related to conducting the procedure of confirmation of learning outcomes (referred to as "RPL") for degree courses not regulated by education standards, conducted as free or paid degree courses, is as follows:

1	Fee for conducting the procedure of confirmation of learning outcomes based solely on the documentation attached to the Candidate's application	PLN 1,325
2	Fee for each additional piece of evidence provided by the University (the maximum number of additional pieces of evidence is 5)	PLN 459 (the maximum amount for additional pieces of evidence is PLN 2295).
3	Maximum rate for conducting the full RPL procedure (sum of items 1 and 2)	PLN 3,620

1. The rules and deadlines for payment of fees referred to in sec. 1 are specified in the agreement on the conditions of payment for the confirmation of learning outcomes.

Chapter VIII. Refund of fees for the period of non-attendance

Art. 7

1. A student / person admitted to studies may apply for a refund of the paid tuition fee for the period of non-attendance, in accordance with the rules set out in sec. 2–9.
2. A student may apply for a refund of the paid fee for the period of non-attendance, including in the case of:
 - 1) obtaining consent for a leave of absence, excluding leave that provides for the right to participate in classes
 - 2) and to take credits and examinations,
 - 3) removal from the student list,
 - 4) other significant documented fortuitous events.
3. A person admitted to the 1st year of studies may apply for a refund of the paid tuition fee for the period of non-attendance in the event of not commencing studies or resigning from studies.
4. The refund of the fee for the period of non-attendance takes place:
 - 1) in full before the start of studies, in the case of: obtaining consent for a leave of absence, submitting a resignation, or removal from the student list,
 - 2) in an amount proportional to the period of non-attendance.
5. The amount of the partial fee refund is calculated according to the formula:

$Z = (O/L) \times N$, where:

Z – the amount of the part of the fee subject to refund,

O – the amount of the annual tuition fee related to education in degree courses, i.e. the fee amount for a given academic year in a specific degree course or subject,

L – the number of teaching hours assigned to a given year of study in a specific degree course or subject, resulting from the curriculum,

N – the actual number of teaching hours of non-attendance calculated after the date of: obtaining consent for a leave of absence, submitting a written notice of resignation, or removal from the student list.

6. The actual number of teaching hours of non-attendance is determined on the basis of the documentation held regarding the student.
7. The refund of the fee for the period of non-attendance takes place at the request of the student / person admitted to studies, submitted to the dean's office of the relevant faculty or the dean's office of the branch.

8. A member of the dean's office staff completes the application with the amount of the refund of the paid fee for the period of non-attendance, and then forwards it for consideration by the Rector or a person authorised by them.
9. The dean of the relevant faculty or the dean of the branch decides on the refund of the fee.

Art. 8

1. In the event of obtaining a leave of absence without consent to participate in certain classes and to take credits and examinations during the leave, before the tuition fee payment deadline, the student shall not pay the fee for the duration of the leave of absence.
2. If a student is granted the leave of absence referred to in sec. 1 after having paid the tuition fee, the fee shall be refunded in full, provided that the decision to grant the leave was delivered before the start of the semester.
3. An application for a fee refund is submitted to the dean's office of the relevant faculty or branch. The dean's office attaches information concerning the amount and the method of calculating the refundable fee to the application.

Chapter VIII. Refund of overpayment for studies and tuition fees

Art. 9

1. The refund of an overpayment for tuition fees is made upon a written application of the student to the bank account specified in the application.
2. The fact of the overpayment and its amount are confirmed on the basis of documentation.
3. An overpayment may be credited towards future tuition fee payments.

Chapter IX. Final Provisions

Art. 10

1. The fees referred to in Art. 1 sec. 1 shall be paid in Polish zlotys to the individual bank account of the University indicated in the Wirtualna Uczelnia (Virtual University) system.
2. The person making the payment is obliged to indicate in the bank transfer title: the student's first and last name, the type of fee being paid, and the name of the degree course.
3. The University shall not be held liable for the consequences of incorrect classification of the payment resulting from circumstances on the part of the payer, in particular due to entering the wrong bank account number, lack of or incorrect specification of the type and amount of the fee paid, the degree course, the student's first and last name, or other reasons.
4. The University does not bear the costs associated with making payments (e.g. transfer costs).
5. Statutory interest for delay in payment shall be charged on fees paid after the deadline.
6. The date of fee payment is the day of receipt on the individual bank account of the University indicated in the Wirtualna Uczelnia (Virtual University) system.
7. Failure to pay the fee for the 1st semester of the 1st year or the 1st year of studies by the deadline referred to in Art. 3 sec. 3 points 1 and 2 and Art. 4 sec. 2 points 1 and 2 shall be considered a resignation from studies.
8. Failure to pay or making a partial payment for tuition fees after receiving a final notice to pay may result in removal from the student list and the matter being referred to court proceedings.
9. The timeliness and amount of tuition fee payments are subject to systematic verification.
10. An application to charge interest for delay is directed to the Bursar in the event of failure to pay or making a partial payment.

Art. 11

In the event of any change in the legal situation of the student / person admitted to studies that entails legal or financial consequences in the relations between the parties, the student / person admitted to studies is obliged to immediately inform the University of this fact.

Art. 12

The following fee tables and application templates, which constitute appendices to this ordinance, are hereby introduced:

- 1) Appendix no. 1 – table of fees charged for tuition related to education in free or paid degree courses conducted in Polish,
- 2) Appendix no. 2 – table of fees charged for tuition related to education in free or paid degree courses conducted in English,
- 3) Appendix no. 3 – table of fees charged for education within classes not included in the curriculum in free or paid degree courses, and repeating certain classes due to unsatisfactory academic performance in free or paid degree courses,
- 4) Appendix no. 4 – application for a refund of tuition fees for the period of non-attendance or a refund of an overpayment,
- 5) Appendix no. 5 – application for a partial exemption from tuition fees in paid degree courses,
- 6) Appendix no. 6 – application for payment of tuition fees in instalments,
- 7) Appendix no. 7 – application for conducting classes not included in the curriculum.

Art. 13

1. An application for reconsideration may be submitted against the Rector's decision in matters regulated by the provisions of this ordinance.
2. The Rector, before making a decision, may consult with the dean of the relevant faculty or the dean of the branch, the university student government body, or a legal counsel.
3. Registers of issued decisions are kept according to jurisdiction
by:
 - 1) for decisions issued by the dean – the dean's office,
 - 2) for decisions issued by the Rector – the Student Affairs Department, which forwards the decisions to the relevant dean's office and the party to the proceedings.

Art. 14

The Ordinance enters into force on the date of signing, with effect from the date of the commencement of admission for the 2026/2027 academic year for persons beginning their education from the 2026/2027 academic year.
